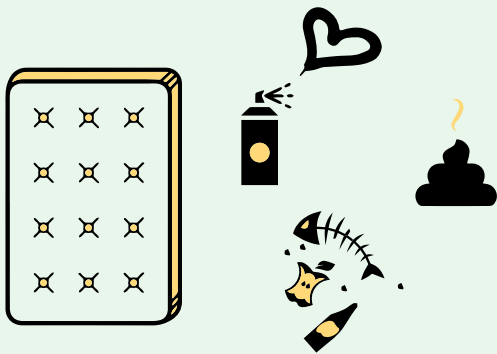

BACK TO BUSINESS SAFETY & SECURITY FUNDS



**Seattle Office of
Economic Development**

The Back to Business program supports small businesses impacted by vandalism and property damage. It offers help in three areas:

Storefront Repair Fund
Grants to help businesses reimburse the costs for fixing damages from vandalism or other property damage.

Storefront Security Fund
A grant to reimburse business owners to cover the cost of improving security.

Neighborhood Business District Investments
Funding to improve public safety and the look of neighborhood business areas.

This program builds on the success of the Storefront Repair Fund, which provided grants to small businesses to repair property damage between 2022 and 2024.
